AMENDMENT OF CUSTOMS REGULATIONS.⁽¹⁾⁽²⁾

Regulations.

No. 16 of 1951.

1. *The Schedule to the Customs Regulations 1921-1941*⁽²⁾⁽³⁾ is amended by deleting Form 9 therefrom and inserting in its stead the following new form:—

INSTRUCTIONS TO MASTERS.

1. This list must be completed in readiness to be handed to the Customs Officer who first visits the vessel. It must be signed by every Member of the Crew (including the Master and Officers). Each man must state opposite his signature or mark the quantity of customable articles, opium, cocaine and other narcotic drugs, in his possession, including any goods or articles intended for another person. If he has nothing, he must state " Nil " or " Nothing ".

2. In the case of articles held for sale on the ship (other than bar stock, being ship's stores, in the charge of the Chief Steward) full details of such articles must be shown on this list against the signature of the person in charge thereof.

3. Any customable articles, opium, cocaine and other narcotic drugs, the property of or in the possession of the Master, or any Member of the Crew, found in the vessel and not enumerated in this list, will be liable to forfeiture, and the owner or person in possession thereof to prosecution.

4. All articles reported on this list must be produced and, if necessary, placed in a secure place to be sealed up by a Customs Officer.

5. Bona fide personal effects in the nature of nick-nacks, &c. in actual use in the cabins of Masters, Officers, &c., need not be reported on the list.

Wireless sets, musical instruments, firearms, ammunition, gramophones and records (number), also typewriters, binoculars, and cameras must be declared and values, numbers and other required particulars shown, but need not be placed under seal if required by the owners. Such articles must be produced to the Customs Officers at the final opri prior to departure overseas.

6. All spirits (including any bottle opened), tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, cigarette papers, cigarillos and biddies must be reported on this list."
