RULES OF COURT⁽¹⁾ (QUEENSLAND, ADOPTED) GAZETTED ON 16.7.1927, IN THEIR APPLICATION TO THE TERRITORY OF NEW GUINEA.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Buildings, Brisbane, the fourteenth day of July, 1927.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by "The Supreme Court Act of 1921" it is enacted that the Governor in Council, with the consent of two or more of the Judges, may from time to time, by Order in Council published in the Gazette, make all such Rules of Court as may be deemed necessary or convenient for regulating the procedure and practice of the Supreme Court, and for the purpose of giving full effect to "The Judicature Act" and "The Supreme Court Act of 1921," and any other Act conferring jurisdiction, power, or authority on the Court: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and with the concurrence of the required number of Judges, doth hereby make the following Rule of Court amending the Rule relating to the Form of Title of Sovereign in Writs, &c., and repealing Rule 1 of the Rules of Court as of the twentieth day of February, 1902:—

1. In all Writs and other Instruments issued from this Court in which the Royal Style and Titles are used, the same shall be set forth as follows:—

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

2. Rule 1 of the Rules of Court as of Thursday, the twentieth day of February, 1902, is hereby repealed.

And the Honourable the Attorney-General is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

⁽a) The Judiciary Ordinance 1932 repealed the former S.19(4) of the Judiciary Ordinance 1921-1931, and inserted in its stead the present S. 19(4), which adopts the Rules of Court of the Supreme Court of Queensland as in force in Queensland on 5th December, 1932. The former S. 19 (4) read as follows:—
"(4.) Until Rules of Court are made in pursuance of this Section the practice and procedure of the Supreme Court of Queensland shall be in force within the Central Court."
