POUNDS ORDINANCE 1920-1925.(1)

THEREAS in view of the exigencies of the British Military Administration of the Colony of German New Guinea it is expedient to make provision for the impounding of stray horses and other animals Now therefore I Thomas Griffiths Brigadier-General British Military Administrator of the said Colony do hereby order enact and proclaim as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pounds Ordinance Short title. 1920-1925(1) and shall come into force upon publication in the Government Gazette. (1)

- 2. The Order prohibiting the keeping of horses, cattle and goats untethered within the limits of the town of Rabaul dated the 1st November 1915 is hereby repealed.
- 3. From and after the coming into force of this Ordinance all horses, cattle and other animals found straying and at large within the limits of the township of Rabaul⁽²⁾ shall be liable to be impounded and the owner thereof or a person acting on his behalf

and include:—— All the land commencing at a point on the foreshore of Rabaul Bay opposite the intersection of the North Coast and Kokopo Roads and bounded on the West by the North Coast Road running Northerly to the Ratavul Pass thence by the main watershed running Easterly to the summit of North Daughter thence South-Easterly along the watershed to its intersection with a high ridge (South of Namanula Hospital) thence on the South by that ridge running Westerly to a small creek by that creek downward to the shores of Rabaul Bay and thence by the shores of Rabaul Bay Northerly and Westerly to the point of commencement."

ANIMALS AND BIRDS-

with his authority may recover any animal so impounded upon payment of the prescribed fee together with costs and expenses incurred in the impounding and maintenance of such animal provided that the right to recover such animal may be barred if application is not made within fourteen days of the impounding.

5. The owner or person having control of an animal, who allows such animal to stray at large in the township of Rabaul shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and in addition to the liability incurred by the provisions before set out, shall be liable, upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
