STANDARD TIME ORDINANCE · 1923.⁽¹⁾

No. 11 of 1923.

An Ordinance to establish a Standard of Time in the Territory.

 $\mathbf{B}^{\mathbf{E}}$ it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *New Guinea Act* 1920, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Standard Time Ordinance Short title. 1923.⁽¹⁾

2. The mean time of the One hundred and fiftieth meridian of longitude east of Greenwich in England shall be deemed and is hereby declared to be standard time throughout the Territory.

3. Whenever any expression of time occurs in any Act, Statute, Ordinance, Regulation or law, or in any deed or in any instrument whatsoever, and whenever the doing or not doing anything at a certain time of day or night, or during a certain part of the day or the night, has an effect in law, such time shall, unless it is otherwise specifically stated, be held to be standard time throughout the Territory as declared by this Ordinance.

The time of the 150th meridian to be standard time.

Time mentioned in Ordinances &c. to mean standard time.
