## THE CRIMINAL CODE AMENDMENT ORDIN-ANCE OF 1907. (1)

## No. 4 of 1907.

## An Ordinance to amend the Criminal Code.

BE it enacted by the Administrator of Papua by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :--

1. Any person who commits the crime of murder as defined by Murder in term Section 302 of "The Criminal Code" is liable to imprisonment of the Code to be with hard labour for life with or without solitary confinement; and punished with imprisonment. Section 305 of the said Code so far as it relates to murder is repealed.

2. When a person is convicted of any crime punishable with Recording death if the Court is of opinion that under the circumstances of the death. case it is proper that the offender should be recommended for the Royal mercy the Court may if it thinks fit direct the proper Officer instead of asking the offender whether he has anything to say why sentence of death should not be passed upon him to ask the offender and thereupon such Officer is to ask the offender whether he has anything to say why judgment of death should not be recorded against him.

In any such case the Court may abstain from pronouncing sentence of death and may instead thereof order judgment of death to be entered of record.

And thereupon the proper Officer is to enter judgment of death on record against the offender in the usual form as if sentence of death had actually been pronounced by the Court against the offender in open Court.
