## EXPLOSIVES STORAGE RATES ORDINANCE. 1914.(1)

## No. 9 of 1914.

## An Ordinance relating to Explosives.

RE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:--

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Explosives Storage Rates Short title. Ordinance, 1914.(1)
  - 2. The Inflammable Oils Ordinance of 1906 is repealed.

Repeal.

3.—(1.) The charges and rent for the storage of gun powder Charges and 3.—(1.) The charges and rent for the state of the deposited in a storage of or other explosive substances now or hereafter to be deposited in a storage of The Navigation Act explosives. Government magazine under the provisions of The Navigation Act of 1876 (Queensland adopted) to be paid by the importer or owner thereof shall be at such rate as the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council<sup>(2)</sup> shall from time to time determine.

(2.) The rate so determined shall be declared by notice<sup>(3)</sup> in the Gazette.
