## THE FISH PROTECTION ORDINANCE OF 1898.(1)

## No. 7 of 1898.

## An Ordinance for the Protection of Fish.

B E it enacted by the Administrator of British New Guinea with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :---

1. The term "Prohibited Waters" when used herein shall mean Defining the waters which the Administrator with the advice of the Executive Council may by Proclamation<sup>(2)</sup> from time to time declare to be prohibited waters within the meaning of this Ordinance.

2. No person shall except under a permit use dynamite or Using dynamite, other explosive substance to catch or destroy fish in any prohibited waters.

The Administrator or any person empowered by him may issue to any person a written permit to use in the manner therein prescribed any explosive to catch or to destroy fish in prohibited waters.

Any person who commits a breach of the provisions of this section shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in default of payment of such penalty be liable to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding six months.

3. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as The Fish short title. Protection Ordinance of 1898.<sup>(1)</sup>

(2) By Proclamation dated 14.9.1898 and published in British N.G. Govt. Gaz. of 24.9.1898, the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, declared the following waters to be prohibited waters for the purposes of this Ordinance:---

"1. All inland waters of the Possession.

2. The waters of the sea that form the territorial sea waters of the Possession."
