STALLIONS LICENSING ORDINANCE, 1912. (1)

No. 50 of 1912.

An Ordinance for the Improvement of the Breed of Horses.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:-

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as the Stallions Short title. Licensing Ordinance, 1912. (1)

ANIMALS AND BIRDS-

Licence to keep stallions. Fiji 21, 1909, s. 5.

- 5.—(1.) Every person within any proclaimed area keeping any stallion of the age of one year or upwards shall obtain a licence in the form set out in the schedule hereto or to the like effect authorizing him to keep the same.
- (2.) The licence shall be issued by an inspector after the stallion in respect of which it is issued has been inspected by him.
- .(3.) If on inspection the stallion shall not appear to the inspector fit for breeding purposes he shall not issue a licence.
- (4.) A fee of Five pounds shall be payable for each licence issued.

Penalty for keeping stallions without licence. Fiji Ib. s. 6.

6. After the expiration of three months from the commencement of this Ordinance in any proclaimed area no person shall keep upon his lands and premises or any lands and premises occupied by him within such area any stallion of the age of one year or upwards unless he shall have obtained a licence in the form set forth in the schedule hereto.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

Inspection of animals. Fiji Ib. s. 7.

7. An inspector shall at least once in every twelve months inspect the stallions within a proclaimed area: Provided that if an inspector shall at any time observe in a proclaimed area any stallion of the age of one year or upwards and of which he knows the owner it shall be his duty and he is hereby empowered to deal with that animal and to provide for the castration thereof if deemed proper in the same manner as he is by this Ordinance empowered to deal with stallions when making an inspection directed by this section. If the inspector does not know the owner of the stallion he may take possession of and remove it to any convenient place and after giving one week's notice of his intention so to do in the Gazette or any newspaper published in the Territory may castrate the stallion. The owner when ascertained shall be liable to pay all fees costs and charges of taking possession of removing keeping and castrating such stallion and the cost of any such notice.

Collection of animals for inspection. Fiji Ib. s. 8.

8. An owner on requirement by an inspector whether notice of inspection has been given or not shall cause all stallions kept by him or permitted to remain upon the lands and premises occupied or used by him in a proclaimed area to be collected for inspection.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Stallions unfit for stud purposes. Fiji Ib. s. 9. 9. If upon inspection an inspector shall consider that any stallion is not a fit and proper animal to be kept for stud purposes and for the purpose of breeding stock he shall direct the stallion to be castrated on or before a day not earlier than one month after

the day on which the direction is given: Provided that an owner may if he shall so elect cause the stallion to be slaughtered on or before the day named by the inspector instead of being castrated.

Any owner neglecting or omitting to castrate a stal- Penalty for lion in pursuance of a direction given by an inspector under the comply with powers conferred by the last preceding section or slaughter it shall directions of inspector. be liable upon conviction in a summary manner before a magistrate Fiji 21, 1909, to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds and in default of payment to a term of imprisonment not exceeding six months.

11. An inspector or sub-inspector and his servants and agents Powers to while engaged in the performance of any duties imposed upon him lands. by this Ordinance may enter into or upon any lands premises or Fiji Ib. s. 13. buildings within a proclaimed area upon which any stallion may then be or upon which he may have reasonable cause for believing that any stallion may then be and while upon or in those lands premises or buildings may do all reasonable acts and things for the purpose of enabling him to carry out and perform the duties imposed upon him by this Ordinance.

12. No inspector or sub-inspector nor servant or agent em- Indemnity. ployed by such inspector or sub-inspector shall be liable for any Fiji Ib. s. 14. loss or damage sustained by any owner by reason of the death of or any injury to a stallion in consequence of its being castrated or by reason of any error in judgment as to the age of any stallion.
