USURY ACT OF 1834⁽¹⁾⁽²⁾ (QUEENSLAND, ADOPTED) IN ITS APPLICATION TO THE TERRITORY OF PAPUA.

An Act for removing doubts respecting the application to New South Wales of the Laws and Statutes of England relating to Usury and to limit and define the rate of Interest which may be recovered in cases where it hath not been previously agreed on between the parties.

B^E it enacted and declared by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof That the Laws and Statutes of England relating to Usury shall be deemed taken and adjudged not to extend to the said Colony or its Dependencies or to be in force within the same.

(1) The Usury Act of 1834 of Queensland, in its application to the Territory of Papua, comprises the original Usury Act of 1834 of Queensland as amended by the other Act of Queensland referred to in Part I of the following Table, and as amended by the Ordinance of the Territory of Papua referred to in Part II of the following Table:—

It was given the title of "The Usury Act of 1834," in the State of Queensland by The Acts Shortening Act Amendment Act of 1903, of Queensland, which Act was, however, not adopted as a law of the Territory of Papua by any Ordinance of the Territory of Papua.
