Prices Regulation Act 1949, as amended to date

MAXIMUM PRICES FOR PETROL, DISTILLATE AND LIGHTING KEROSENE

I, MILTON FREDERICK ROBERTS, a Deputy Price Controller, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Prices Regulation Act* 1949, as amended to date, and all other powers me enabling do hereby make the following Order under that Act:—

PRICES ORDER No. 122

1. CITATION.

This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 122.

2. COMMENCEMENT.

This Order shall come into operation on the date of publication of this Order in the Gazette.

3. REVOCATION.

The Prices Orders specified in Schedule 2 of this Order are revoked.

4. DEFINITIONS.

In this Order-

Maximum Prices for Petrol, Distillate and Lighting Kerosene.—continued

"petrol" includes any substance normally sold as petrol whether or not containing additives of any kind;

"distillate" includes any substance normally sold as automotive distillate whether or not containing additives of any kind;

"kerosene" includes any substance normally sold as kerosene, being a medium refined petroleum product as used for lighting and cooking in home appliances, whether or not containing additives of any kind;

"wholesaler" in relation to petrol, distillate or kerosene means a person or a firm who sells petrol, distillate or kerosene for the purpose of resale and not for the purpose of use;

"supplier" in relation to petrol, distillate or kerosene, means a person or a firm who sells petrol, distillate or kerosene for the purpose of use;

"retail" means for the purpose of consumption or use.

5. MAXIMUM PRICE.

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- (i) Support to Subclause (ii) of this clause, where petrol, distillate or kerosene is supplied—
 - (a) at a locality specified in the first column of Schedule 1 to this Order; or
 - (b) at some other place to which the petrol, distillate or kerosene is transported from any such locality by or on behalf of a wholesaler or the supplier;

the maximum price per gallon at which the petrol, distillate or kerosene may be supplied is the sum of-

- (c) the maximum retail selling price specified in the second, third or fourth column as the case may be, of Schedule 1 in relation to the locality concerned; and
- (d) the amount (if any) charged for the transport referred to in paragraph (b) of this subclause.
- (ii) Where the maximum price of any quantity of petrol, distillate or kerosene supplied at any one time, calculated in accordance with Subclause (i) of this clause is an amount involving a fraction of a cent, the supplier may charge to the next whole cent.

6. SUPPLY TO GOVERNMENT ETC.

Nothing in this Order applies to or in relation to the supply of petrol, distillate or kerosene to the Government, Australia or a Statutory Authority of the Government or Australia.

7. NOTICES FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES.

Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Order, the Controller may, by notice in writing to any person or body or association of persons, fix the maximum price at which petrol, distillate or kerosene may be sold, and thereupon that maximum price is the price for the purpose of the *Prices Regulation Act* 1949, as amended to date, accordingly.
