PROCLAMATION OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA'S INDEPENDENCE

AT THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SIXTEENTH DAY OF SEPTEMBER 1975, THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL, HIS EXCELLENCY SIR JOHN GUISE, K.B.E., AT PORT MORESBY, PROCLAIMED THE INDEPENDENCE AND FULL SOVEREIGNTY OF THE INDEPENDENT STATE OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA, AND THE COMING INTO FORCE OF THE CONSTITUTION ADOPTED ON THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF AUGUST, 1975 BY THE CONSIITUENT ASSEMBLY OF THE ELECTED NATIONAL REPRESENTATIVES OF THE PEOPLE OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA.

OPENING OF THE FIRST PARLIAMENT

In accordance with Section 1 of the Organic Law on the First Meetings of the National Parliament, the first meeting of the First National Parliament will commence at 2 p.m. this day at Parliament House, Port Moresby. The Parliament will be officially opened by His Royal Highness the Prince Charles, Prince of Wales K.G.

FIRST GOVERNOR-GENERAL'S ASSUMPTION OF OFFICE

On this day, by virtue of Section 268 of the Constitution, His Excellency Sir John Guise K.B.E. assumed office as the First Governor-General of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea, and in accordance with Section 272 of the Constitution will take the oath of allegiance as prescribed by Section 7 of the Constitution, and will make the Declaration of Loyalty and the Declaration of Office as prescribed by Section 6 and Schedule 3 of the Constitution, respectively in the following terms—

Oath of Allegiance

"I, JOHN GUISE, do swear that I will well and truly serve and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Her heirs and successors according to law.

SO HELP ME GOD!".

First Governor-General's Assumption of Office-continued

Declaration of Loyalty

"I, JOHN GUISE, realizing fully the responsibilities to which I am committing myself and the consequences of not living up to this Declaration and those responsibilities, freely and willingly declare my loyalty to the Independent State of Papua New Guinea and its People and to the Constitution of Papua New Guinea adopted by the Constitutent Assembly on 15th August, 1975, as altered from time to time in accordance with its provisions, and promise that I will uphold the Constitution and the laws of Papua New Guinea."

Declaration of Office

"I, JOHN GUISE, do promise and declare that I will well and truly serve the Independent State of Papua New Guinea and its People in the office of Governor-General.".

FIRST CHIEF JUSTICE

On this day, by virtue of Section 271 of the Constitution, the Honourable Thomas Sydney Frost became the first Chief Justice of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea, and in accordance with Section 272 of the Constitution, will duly make the Judicial Declaration prescribed by Schedule 4 to the Constitution, in the following terms—

"I, THOMAS SYDNEY FROST, do promise and declare that I will well and truly serve the Independent State of Papua New Guinea and its People in the office of Chief Justice, that I will in all things uphold the Constitution and the laws of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea, and I will do right to all manner of people in accordance therewith, without fear or favour, affection or ill-will.

FIRST PRIME MINISTER

On this day, by virtue of Section 270 of the Constitution, the Honourable Machael Somare M.P. became the First Prime Minister of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea, and in accordance with Section 272 of the Constitution will duly make the Declaration of Loyalty and the Declaration of Office prescribed by Section 6 and Schedule 3 of the Constitution respectively, in the following terms—

Declaration of Loyalty

"I, MICHAEL THOMAS SOMARE, realizing fully the responsibilities to which I am committing myself and the consequences of not living up to this Declaration and those responsibilities, freely and willingly declare my loyalty to the Independent State of Papua New Guinea and its People and to the Constitution of Papua New Guinea adopted by the Constituent Assembly on 15th August, 1975, as altered from time to time in accordance with its provisions, and promise that I will uphold the Constitution and the laws of Papua New Guinea."

Declaration of Office

"I, MICHAEL THOMAS SOMARE, do promise and declare that I will well and truly serve the Independent State of Papua New Guinea and its People in the office of Prime Minister.".

FIRST SPEAKER

On this day, by virtue of Section 269 of the Constitution, the HONOURABLE BARRY BLYTH HOLLOWAY C.B.E. became the first Speaker of the National Parliament of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea, and in accordance with Section 272 of the Constitution will duly make the Declaration of Loyalty and the Declaration of Office prescribed by Section 6 and Schedule 3 of the Constitution respectively, in the following terms—

Declaration of Loyalty

"I, Albert Maori Kiki, realizing fully the responsibilities to which I am committing myself and the consequences of not living up to this Declaration and those responsibilities, freely and willingly declare my loyalty to the Independent State of Papua New Guinea and its People and to the Constitution of Papua New Guinea adopted by the Constituent Assembly on 15th August, 1975, as altered from time to time in accordance with its provisions, and promise that I will uphold the Constitution and the laws of Papua New Guinea."
