MANUS PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT

No. 1 of 1978

Retail Sales Tax Rates (Alcoholic Liquor) Act 1978,

being

An Act to fix the rates of retail sales tax on alcoholic liquor and for related purposes, to be read as one with the Retail Sales Tax Administration Act 1977 and the Taxation Administration (General) Act 1977,

MADE by the Assembly to come into operation in accordance with a notice published in the Gazette by the Premier.

1. INTERPRETATION.

In this Act-

"alcohol" means ethyl alcohol;

"alcoholic liquor" means a liquid ordinarily used as a drink which contains alcohol and is specified in Column 2 of the Schedule.

2. IMPOSITION OF TAX ON ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS.

Alcoholic liquors are taxable goods within the meaning of the Principal Acts and retail sales tax is payable on those goods accordingly.

3. RATES OF TAX.

The rates of retail sales tax on alcoholic liquors are as set out in Column 3 of the Schedule.

4. EXEMPTIONS.

- (1) The following goods are exempt from the retail sales tax provided for by this Act:
 - (a) drinks usually considered non-intoxicating containing less than 1.15 per cent by volume of alcohol; and
 - (b) spirituous or distilled perfume sold in good faith as perfume; and
 - (c) liquor sold simply as a medicine or for medical purposes by, or under the direction of, a medical practitioner; and
 - (d) liquor sold, for medicinal purposes only, by a pharmacist or other person authorized by law for the purpose; and
 - (e) liquor sold in an aircraft in flight; and
 - (f) liquor sold, with the approval of the Liquor Licensing Commission appointed under the Liquor (Licensing) Act 1963 of the National Government by an auctioneer licenced under any law of Papua New Guinea, in good faith and in the course of his business; and
- No. 2 Retail Sales Tax Rates (Alcoholic Liquor) 1978
 - (g) liquor sold as being taken in execution, forfeited or seized under any law of Papua New Guinea; and
 - (h) liquor sold in a vessel while on a voyage between a port in the province and a port outside the province (including liquor sold on the vessel while at sea between ports in the province).
- (2) If a person alleges that he is exempt from paying retail sales tax by virtue of Subsection (1) it is for him to prove that he is exempt.
 - (3) Subsection (1) (f) does not apply unless the person selling liquor—
 - (a) has given to the Chief Provincial Collector not less than 48 hours' written notice of his intention to sell the liquor, together with details of the liquor to be sold; and
 - (b) as soon as practicable after the sale, notifies the Chief Provincial Collector of the details of the liquor sold and of the persons to whom it is sold.

Income Tax Act 1959

RETURN OF INCOME

I, John Wolfgang Lohberger, Chief Collector of Taxes, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Income Tax Act 1959 and all other powers me enabling, hereby require returns of all income derived during the period 1st July, 1977 to 31st December, 1978 by individuals and trusts and the period 1st January, 1978 to 31st December, 1978 by a company (or the accounting period, if any, adopted under the Act in lieu of that period), to be furnished to me in such of the forms provided for the purpose as are applicable, containing the information and particulars mentioned or referred to in the relevant forms, and verified by declaration as therein set forth, and accompanied by all such balance sheets, profit and loss accounts, statement and other documents as are mentioned in the forms or as are requisite, at the appropriate place, on or before the dates hereinafter stated.

Persons required to furnish returns	Returns to be lodged on or before
Except as provided in this item, every person resident in Papua New Guinea whose total income from all sources, both in and out of Papua New Guinea (other than exempt income as defined in the <i>Income Tax Act</i> 1959), derived exclusively, under one or more of the following headings, namely, remuneration as an employee, stipend, rent, interest, annuities, dividends or any other source was in excess of K936. A person resident in Papua New Guinea deriving income exclusively from salary and wages, from which Tax Instalment Deduction have been deducted in accordance with the provision of the Income Tax Act and Regulations, and who derives other income which does not exceed K100 is not required to lodge a return of income.	28th February, 1978
Every person resident in Papua New Guinea whose total income derived from all sources both in and out of Papua New Guinea, derived wholly or partly from a source which is a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term, including a professional business, was in excess of K936.	28th February, 1978
Every person being a member of a partnership who is a resident in Papua New Guinea (other than a company) whose total income from the partnership and all other sources both in and out of Papua New Guinea was in excess of K936.	28th February, 1978
Every person who is a resident of Papua New Guinea whose total income from a trust estate and all other sources both in and out of Papua New Guinea was in excess of K936.	28th February, 1978
Every trust estate which is resident in Papua New Guinea whose total income derived from all sources in and out of Papua New Guinea was in excess of K4.	28th February, 1978
Every company resident in Papua New Guinea whose total income derived from all sources, both in and out of Papua New Guinea, was in excess of K2.	28th February, 1978
Every non-resident person (other than a company) whose total income derived from all sources in Papua New Guinea was in excess of K936 other than a person whose income from Papua New Guinea sources consisted solely of dividends.	28th February, 1978
Every trust estate which is not resident in Papua New Guinea whose total income derived from all sources in Papua New Guinea was in excess of K4.	28th February, 1978
Every non-resident company whose total income derived from all sources in Papua New Guinea was K2, or in excess of K2, other than a company whose income from Papua New Guinea consisted solely of dividends.	28th February, 1978
Every person or company who has adopted, under the <i>Income Tax Act</i> 1959, an accounting period being the twelve months ending on some date other than 31st December, 1978.	28th February, 1978 or the sixtieth day after the last day of the accounting period so adopted, whichever date is the later.
Every religious and charitable institution whose income from any commercial undertaking in or out of Papua New Guinea exceeds K2.	30th April, 1978
All Provincial Governments, Local Government Councils and local level government bodies established by a provincial law, whose income from commercial activities, other than from the provision of normal council services solely to council taxpayers exceeds K2.	30th April, 1978

Every partnership is required to lodge a return showing the income of the partnership and the return is required to be furnished on or before 28th February, 1978, by the partners resident in Papua New Guinea or by any one of them. When there is no partner resident in Papua New Guinea, the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Papua New Guinea for the partnership.

A return of the total income of every trust is required to be furnished, on or before 28th February, 1978, by the trustees thereof resident in Papua New Guinea or by any one of them. When there is no trustee resident in Papua New Guinea, the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Papua New Guinea for the trustee.

Every agent for a principal, whether resident or non-resident, is required to furnish a return demanded of his principal.

Every company is required to furnish in addition to the return of income, separate statements to accompany the return showing—

- (a) the name and address of each resident shareholder to whom dividends in excess of K100 were paid or credited, and the amount paid or credited to each during the year ended 31st December, 1978;
- (b) the name and address of each resident person to whom interest in excess of K100 was paid or credited, and the amount paid or credited to each during the year ended 31st December, 1978;
- (c) the name and address of each non-resident company to which dividends and/or interest was paid or credited, and the amount paid or credited during the year ended 31st December, 1978;

Return of Income—continued

- (d) the name and address of each non-resident person to whom dividends and/or interest in excess of K100 was paid or credited, and the amount paid or credited to each during the year ended 31st December, 1978;
- (e) the total amount of dividends and the total amount of interest paid or credited to non-residents during the year ended 31st December, 1978;
- (f) the total amount of interest paid or credited, during the period covered by the return, to debenture holders who are not residents of Papua New Guinea on money secured by debentures of the company, and used in Papua New Guinea, or used in acquiring assets for use or disposal in Papua New Guinea, and to depositors who are not residents of Papua New Guinea on money lodged at interest in Papua New Guinea with the company, after deducting—
 - (i) interest paid or credited outside Papua New Guinea to persons who are not residents of Papua New Guinea on debentures issued outside Papua New Guinea;
 - (ii) unless the Chief Collector otherwise directs interest paid or credited to a company which has a public officer duly appointed under the Act; and
 - (iii) interest of K936 or less paid or credited to each non-resident not being a company; and
- (g) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the period covered by the return, in respect of debentures payable to bearer, the names and addresses of the holders of which are not supplied to the Chief Collector.

A statement showing the name and address of each depositor to whom interest in excess of K100 was paid or credited and the amount of interest paid or credited to each during the year ended 31st December, 1978, is hereby required to be furnished by every person or institution holding money lodged at interest in Papua New Guinea.

By virtue of the provisions of Section 191 of the Act, I hereby require a return of the amounts paid or payable in or out of Papua New Guinea in respect of the carriage of passengers, livestock, mails or goods shipped in Papua New Guinea in a ship belonging to or chartered by a person whose principal place of business is out of Papua New Guinea to be furnished by the master of the ship or the agent or other representative in Papua New Guinea of the owner or charterer. Such return showing the amounts paid or payable during the year ended 31st December, 1978, is required to be furnished on or before 30th April, 1979.

Failure to duly furnish the required returns renders the person concerned liable to a penalty of not less than K50 or more than K400 as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.

 - (b) give details of the matter referred to in paragraph (a) of Condition 1 hereof;
 - (c) fully document the economic viability of their proposal;
 - (d) state the make and model of vehicles proposed for registration; and
 - (e) where equity in the business is not wholly Papua New Guinean, state the full details of the company shareholding structure including the basis on which Papua New Guinean equity is being established.
- 3. Applications may be objected to by the Commissioner of Police and rejected by the Madang Interim Provincial Government on the grounds that the applicant does not comply with one or more of the matters referred to in Condition 1 hereof.
- 4. In the event of an objection to an application by the Commissioner of Police, the applicant will be given notice of the objection and the grounds therefore and will be afforded an opportunity to be heard on the objections.
- 5. Where a certificate of registration is granted to an applicant who is about to be engaged solely in the business of operating private hire cars or public hire cars, or in that business jointly with some other business, and that applicant does not so engage within a reasonable time after the grant, the Commissioner of Police may cancel the certificate of registration.
