DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTERS

 - (a) revoke all previous Determinations of Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers; and
 - (b) determine that each minister set out in Column 1 of each Schedule shall have—
 - (i) the title specified in Column 1; and
 - (ii) the responsibilities specified in Column 2; and
 - (iii) the responsibilities for administering the Act (or part of an Act) specified in Column 3, and set out opposite the name of the Minister.

A Law to alter the Organic Law on Provincial Boundaries by altering the boundaries of the Eastern Highlands Province and describing the boundaries of a new province namely Kainantu, and for related purposes,

MADE by the National Parliament.

1. PROVINCES (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 1).

Section 1 of the Organic Law on Provincial Boundaries is amended by inserting after "(b) Gulf Province" the following "(ba) Kainantu Province".

2. AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE.

The Schedule to the Principal Law is amended—

- (a) by deleting the description of the boundaries of the Eastern Highlands Province and inserting the descriptions of boundaries specified in Schedule 1 of this Law; and
- (b) by inserting after the description of boundaries of Gulf Province the name and description of boundaries specified in Schedule 2 of this Law.
