3. The Enterprise shall not without the prior approval of the Minister establish a place of business in any location in Papua New Guinea other than Allotment 7, Section 5 and Allotment 8, Section 46, Lae, Morobe Province.

4. The Enterprise will comply with all and any obligations and conditions relating to the training of employees and the localisation of its staff (including both employees and officers of the Enterprise) which may from time to time be laid down by the Department of Labour and Employment (or any other Department which succeeds to the functions of that Department) or prescribed or declared under the *Employment (Training and Regulation) Act* as in force from time to time dealing with training and localisation of staff.

5. If the Enterprise has not at the expiration of one month from the date of registration commenced carrying on business in any of the activities for which it is hereby registered, it shall not thereafter commence such activity without the prior written consent of NIDA.

## GENERAL PRICES ORDER 1983

being

## A General Price Order.

MADE by the Price Controller under the *Prices Regulations Act* (Chapter 320) to come into operation on the date of publication in the *National Gazette*.

## 1. REPEAL

All Prices Orders in force immediately before the commencement of this Order are repealed.

## 2. Interpretation

In this Order, unless some other meaning is clearly intended:—

“cost into store”, in relation to specified goods purchased from a manufacturer or wholesaler in the country, means the sum of the following amounts:

- (a) the amount charged by the manufacturer or wholesaler for the specified goods; and
- (b) the cost to the purchaser, in so far as it is not part of the amount specified in paragraph (a), of freight, transport, wharfage, handling and insurance necessarily incurred in moving specified goods from their place at the time of purchase to the purchaser's store; and

“landed cost”, in relation to specified goods purchased from outside the country, means the sum of the following amounts—

- (a) the amount charged by the manufacturer or wholesaler for the specified goods; and
- (b) buying commission paid by the purchaser to any person not connected with the purchaser not exceeding, in case of goods imported from—
  - (i) Australia or New Zealand—2½%; or
  - (ii) any other place—5%, of the amount specified in paragraph (a); and
- (c) import and export duties, taxes and levies paid by the purchaser of the goods; and
- (d) the cost to the purchaser, in so far as it is not part of the amount specified in paragraph (a), of freight, transport, wharfage (other than demurrage and storage charges), handling and insurance necessarily incurred in moving the specified goods from their place at the time of purchase to the purchaser's store; and
- (e) charges necessarily incurred by the purchaser in preparing customs import entries and obtaining bank drafts and bills; and
- (f) in the case of petrol, distillate, kerosene and aviation gasoline, the cost to the purchaser, in so far as it is not part of the amount specified in paragraphs (a) and (d), of ocean freight, ocean losses, inland losses, landing charges (inclusive of demurrage), marine insurance and fuel additives.

“retail sale” means a sale for consumption and use and not for resale.

“retail sales tax” means a retail sales tax that a Provincial Government may impose by virtue of Section 56 of the Organic Law on Provincial Government;

“specified goods” means goods the maximum sale price of which is fixed by this Order.

## 3. RETAIL SALES TAX—EXCLUSION

Maximum sale prices fixed for specified goods by this Order are exclusive of any retail sales tax on those goods.

## 4. DISPLAY OF PRICES

(1) Subject to Subsection (2), a person who—

- (a) has in his custody or under his control; or
- (b) offers, exhibits or exposes

specified goods for retail sale by him shall—

- (c) display a ticket, label, placard or notice attached to, or displayed with those goods; or
- (d) display on the package, container or dispenser of those goods a notice, stating in clear and legible figures, easily discernible to a person inspecting or wishing to purchase those goods, the price at which they may be bought.

(2) Subsection (1) shall not apply to aviation gasoline.

## 5. CALCULATION OF PRICES

(1) Where the maximum sale price of any quantity of petrol, distillate, kerosene and aviation gasoline sold at one time calculated in accordance with this Order involves a fraction of one tenth of a toea that fraction may be treated as one tenth toea.

(2) Where the maximum sale price of any quantity of specified goods, other than item (1), sold at one time calculated in accordance with this Order involves a fraction of 1 toea that fraction may be treated as 1 toea.

## 6. CONSUMER ITEMS—GENERAL LIMITATION OF MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICE

Subject to Sections 7, 9 and 10, the maximum prices at which a consumer item specified in Column 1 may be sold is—

- (a) in the case of consumer item sold by wholesale—
  - (i) the cost into store, or the landed cost, of that item, as the case may be; plus
  - (ii) the percentage of that cost specified in Column 4 opposite to that item in Column 1 of Schedule 1; or

- (b) in the case of a person who has—
- (i) imported the consumer item; or
  - (ii) purchased the item from a manufacturer in the country and is selling by retail sale—
  - (iii) the landed cost, or cost into store, of that item, as the case may be; plus
  - (iv) the percentage of that cost specified in Column 2 opposite to the reference to that item in Column 1 of Schedule 1; or
- (c) in the case of a person who has purchased the consumer item from a wholesaler in the country and is selling by retail sale—
- (i) the cost into store of that item; plus
  - (ii) the percentage of that cost specified in Column 3 opposite to the reference to that item in Column 1 of Schedule 1;

plus in the case of—

- (d) butter (other than tinned butter)—a freezer allowance calculated at the rate of 7 toea per kg; or
- (e) margarine (other than tinned margarine)—a freezer allowance calculated at the rate of 7 toea per kg; or
- (f) beer sold at a temperature of 6 degrees celsius (43 degrees fahrenheit) or less—a freezer allowance of—
- (i) 24 toea per package of 24 bottles or cans; or
  - (ii) 12 toea per package of 12 bottles or cans; or
  - (iii) 6 toea per package of 6 bottles or cans; or
- (g) aerated waters sold at a temperature of 6 degrees celsius (43 degrees fahrenheit) or less—a freezer allowance of—
- (i) 24 toea per package of 24 bottles, or cans with contents of 285 ml, 300 ml, 333 ml or 370 ml; or
  - (ii) 12 toea per package of 12 bottles, or cans with contents of 285 ml, 300 ml, 333 ml or 370 ml; or
  - (iii) 6 toea per package of 6 bottles, or cans with contents of 285 ml, 300 ml or 370 ml; or
  - (iv) 12 toea per package of 12 bottles of 750 ml; or
  - (v) 15 toea per package of 15 bottles of 500 ml;

and in addition to freezer allowance, a bottle deposit allowance of—

- (i) K1.20 per package of 24 bottles of 258 ml, 300 ml, 333 ml, bottle size; or
  - (ii) 75 toea per package of 15 bottles of 500 ml bottle size; or
  - (iii) 60 toea per package of 12 bottles of 750 ml bottle size.
- (b) poultry—a freezer allowance calculated at the rate of 9 toea per kg; or
- (i) petrol, distillate, kerosene and aviation gasoline—an allowance to take into account the cost of distributing petroleum to main ports in the country of—
- (i) petrol at a rate of 3.239 toea per litre;
  - (ii) distillate at a rate of 2.815 toea per litre;
  - (iii) kerosene at a rate of 2.678 toea per litre;
  - (iv) aviation gasoline at a rate of 1.235 toea per litre; or
- (j) bread—the following allowances be taken into account in determining the wholesale price:
- (i) 2 toea for slicing;
  - (ii) 4 toea for foil wrapping;
  - (iii) 2 toea for milk bread, starched reduced, and protein enriched;
  - (iv) 4 toea for Wholemeal, Kibble, Rye and Fancy Bread;
  - (v) 2 toea discount for unwrapped bread;
  - (vi) nil allowance for ordinary wrapped bread;

and in addition the following retail markups applied in determining the retail price:

- (i) 2 toea for bread with less than 560 grams;
- (ii) 3 toea for bread equal to or in excess of 560 grams

## 7. BEER—MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE IN SPECIFIED LOCALITIES

(1) In this section—

“beer” means beer—

- (a) manufactured in the country; and
- (b) sold in packages containing 24, 12 or 6 bottles or cans approximately 333 ml/375 ml capacity.

(2) The maximum price at which beer may be sold by retail sale in a locality specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 is the amount specified in Column 2 opposite to that locality plus, in the case of beer sold at a temperature of 6 degrees celsius (43 degrees fahrenheit) or less, a freezer allowance of—

- (i) 24 toea per package of 24 bottles or cans; or
- (ii) 12 toea per package of 12 bottles or cans; or
- (iii) 6 toea per package of 6 bottles or cans.

and in addition to freezer allowance, a bottle deposit of—

- (i) K1.20 per package of 24 bottles of 333/375 ml bottle size; or
- (ii) 60 toea per package of 12 bottle of 333/375 ml bottle size; or
- (iii) 30 toea per package of 6 bottles of 333/375 ml bottle size.

**8. BREAD—MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICE IN SPECIFIED LOCALITIES**

(1) In this Section—

“foil-wrapped” means fully enclosed in aluminum or other foil prior to delivery to the place of retail sale;

“milk bread” means bread in which the water-free substances contain not less than 4% by weight of non-fat milk solids; “starch-reduced bread” or “protein increased bread” means bread in which the water-free substances contain not less than 2.7% by weight of nitrogen;

“Weight” and reference to weight means a weight when cold;

“wrapped” means fully enclosed in waxed or grease proof paper, cellulose film, polythene or other similar wrapping prior to delivery to the place of retail sale.

“Wholemeal Bread” means bread which contains wholemeal flour plus water and other ingredients;

“Rye Bread” means bread which contains rye flour plus water and other ingredients;

“Kibble Bread” means bread which contains kibble rye or kibble wheat plus water and other ingredients; and

“Fancy Bread” means bread made into various loaves which are hand moulded.

(2) The maximum price at which bread included in a category described in Column 2 of Schedule 3 may be sold by wholesale or retail sale in a locality specified in Column 1 is that price (if any) specified in Column 3 of that Schedule opposite to the description of that category appropriate to the locality.

**9. RICE—MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICE IN SELECTED LOCALITIES**

The maximum price at which rice included in a variety described in Column 2 of Schedule 4 may be sold by wholesale or retail sale in a locality specified in Column 1 of that Schedule is the price (if any) specified in Column 3 of that Schedule opposite to the description of that variety appropriate to the locality.

**10. CHICKEN—MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES IN SPECIFIED LOCALITIES**

The maximum price at which fresh or frozen chicken, dressed or packaged chickens produced by a producer named in Column 2 of Schedule 5 may be sold by wholesale or retail in a locality specified in Column 1 of that Schedule is the price specified in Column 4 of that Schedule opposite to the size of the chicken specified in Column 3 appropriate to the locality.

**11. CIGARETTES—MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE**

The maximum price at which cigarettes—

- (a) manufactured in the country from either imported or locally grown tobacco; and
- (b) of a brand and size of pack specified in Column 2 of Schedule 6,

may be sold by retail sale—

- (c) in a locality specified in Column 1 of Schedule 6 is the price specified in Column 3; or
- (d) in any other locality—is the price specified in Column 4 of Schedule 6 opposite to the description of that brand and size of pack.

**12. AERATED WATERS—MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE IN SPECIFIED LOCALITIES**

(1) in this section—

“aerated waters” means aerated waters

- (a) manufactured in the country; and
- (b) of a brand and contained in a size and type of container described in Column 2 of Schedule 7,

(2) The maximum price at which aerated waters may be sold by retail in a locality specified in Column 1 of that Schedule is the price specified in Column 3 of that Schedule opposite to the description of that brand and size and type of container appropriate to the locality plus, in the case of aerated waters sold at a temperature of 6 degrees celsius (43 degrees fahrenheit) or less, an allowance of:

- (a) 24 toea per package of 24 bottles, or cans with contents of 285 ml, 300 ml and/or 370 ml; or
- (b) 12 toea per package of 12 bottles, or cans with contents of 285 ml, 300 ml and/or 370 ml; or
- (c) 6 toea per package of 6 bottles, or cans with contents of 285 ml, 300 ml and/or 370 ml; or
- (d) 24 toea per package of 12 bottles of 750 ml; or
- (e) 12 toea per package of 12 bottles of 500 ml.

General Prices Order 1983—*continued***13. PETROL, DISTILLATE, KEROSENE—MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES**

(1) In this section—

“petrol” means motor spirit (or blend) identified as a Class A refined petroleum product containing 97% octane; “distillate” means gas oil identified as a Class C refined petroleum product with a maximum sulphur content of 0.5% wt;

“kerosene” means a dual purpose Class B refined petroleum product used for lighting and cooking in home appliances;

“specified locality” means a locality specified in Column 1 of Schedule 8.

(2) The maximum price at which petrol, distillate, or kerosene may be sold by retail sale at a specified locality is the price specified in Column 2, 3 or 4, as the case may be opposite to the reference to that locality in Column 1 of Schedule 8.

(3) Subject to Subsection (4), the maximum price at which petrol, distillate or kerosene may be sold by retail sale at a place other than a specified locality is—

(a) the price specified in Column 2, 3 or 4, of Schedule 8, as the case may be, opposite to the reference to the specified locality from which the petrol, distillate or kerosene was transported to the place at which it was sold; plus

(b) the cost of that transportation.

(4) The price of petrol, distillate or kerosene sold by retail sale at a place other than a specified locality shall not exceed 16.0 toea per litre more than the price per litre at which petrol, distillate, or kerosene may, by virtue of Subsection (2) be sold by retail sale at Port Moresby.

(5) The amount (if any) appearing in Column 2, 3 and 4, of Schedule 8 under the heading “subsidy” is an indication of the maximum amount that will be paid by way of subsidy under Section 26(2) of the *Prices Regulations Act* (Chapter 320), in respect of petrol, distillate, or kerosene, as the case may be, sold by retail sale at the specified locality appearing opposite that amount in Column 1 of Schedule 8.

**14. AVIATION GASOLINE—MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE IN SPECIFIED LOCALITIES**

(1) In this section—

“aviation gasoline” means a Class A refined petroleum product with a grade of 100/130;

(2) The maximum price at which aviation gasoline may be sold by retail sale at a locality specified in Column 1 of Schedule 9 is the price specified in Column 2 of that Schedule opposite to the reference to that locality in Column 1.

**15. FRUIT AND VEGETABLES**

Fresh and frozen fruit or vegetables are specified goods for the purpose of Section 4 and Section 6.
