Organic Law on National Elections

RE-APPOINTMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF ELECTORAL COMMISSIONER

- I, Kingsford Dibela, G.C.M.G., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Sections 4, 7 and 8 of the Organic Law on National Elections and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the Electoral Commission Appointments Committee, hereby—
 - (a) re-appoint Henry Veratau to be the Electoral Commissioner for a period of six years commencing on and from 29th June, 1984; and
 - (b) appoint Andrew Trawen to act as Electoral Commissioner for a period commencing on and from the date of signature of this instrument up to and including 28th June, 1984.

Public Finances (Control and Audit) Regulation (Chapter 36)

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF POLICE SUPPLY AND TENDERS BOARD

- I, Michael Thomas Somare, Prime Minister and Minister for Finance, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 17 of the Public Finances (Control and Audit) Regulations (Chapter 36) and all other powers me enabling, and acting on the advice of the Secretary for Finance, hereby—
 - (a) establish the Department of Police Supply and Tenders Board and appoint each of the following persons to be members of the Board:—
 - (i) Deputy Commissioner, Department of Police (Chairman);
 - (ii) Assistant Secretary (Consultancy), Department of Finance;
 - (iii) Assistant Secretary (Day Labour), Department of Works and Supply;
 - (iv) Principal Legal Officer (Contracts), Department of Justice. (The representative from the Department of Justice will have no voting right); and
 - (b) appoint a deputy for each of the following members of the Board:-
 - (i) in the case of the Deputy Commissioner, the Director of Logistics, Department of Police;
 - (ii) in the case of the Assistant Secretary (Consultancy), the Senior Management Consultant, Department of Finance;
 - (iii) in the case of the Assistant Secretary (Day Labour), the District Quantity Surveyor (National Capital District), Department of Works and Supply;
 - (iv) in the case of the Principal Legal Officer (Contracts), the Senior Legal Officer (Contracts), Department of Justice. (The representative from the Department of Justice will have no voting right); and
 - (c) determine that the limits of authority and jurisdiction of the Board shall be to invite tenders and award contracts for maintenance services (civil works) necessary for the efficient operation of the Department of Police for and on behalf of the State. The Chairman of the Board may enter into and execute such contracts up to K100 000. Recommendations for contracts between K100 000 and K300 000 shall be submitted to the Minister for Finance. For contracts exceeding K300 000, recommendations shall be forwarded to the Head of the Department (Police), who shall then submit them to the National Executive Council; and
 - (d) fix a quorum for a meeting to be three persons (excluding the non-voting representative) of whom no more than one shall be a deputy.

THE CONSTITUTION

ALTERATION TO THE CONSTITUTION

The Honourable Member for Tambul-Nebilyer, Mr Thomas Negints, proposes to alter the Constitution, and pursuant to the requirements of Section 14(2) (Making of alterations to the Constitution and Organic Laws) of the Constitution, I, Timothy Bonga, Speaker of the National Parliament, hereby publish the proposed Law—

Constitutional Amendment (Citizenship)

ARRANGEMENT OF CLAUSES

- 1. Citizenship by Naturalization (Amendment of Section 67).
- 2. Application for Naturalization (Amendment of Section 69).
- 3. Automatic Loss of Citizenship (Amendment of Section 70).

PROPOSED LAW TO ALTER THE CONSTITUTION

entitled

Constitutional Amendment (Citizenship)

being

A law to alter the Constitution by amending certain provisions relating to citizenship matters made in accordance with Section 55 for the welfare and protection of automatic citizens as an underprivileged and less advanced group.

MADE by the National Parliament.

1. CITIZENSHIP BY NATURALIZATION (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 67).

Section 67 of the Constitution is amended by-

- (a) deleting subsection (1) and substituting the following—
 - "(a) Subject to Section 69(3) a person who has resided continuously in the country for at least eight years may apply to the Minister responsible for citizenship matters to be naturalized as a citizen, and the Minister may, if he is satisfied as to the matters referred to in subsection (2), in his deliberate judgement (but subject to Division 4 (Citizenship Advisory Committee) grant or refuse the application."; and
- (b) deleting from subsection (2) the words "To be eligible for naturalization" and inserting in their place the words "Subject to Section 69(3), to be eligible for naturalization.".

APPLICATION FOR NATURALIZATION (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 69).

Section 69 of the Constitution is amended by-

- (a) deleting subsection (1) and substituting the following—
 - "(1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), an application for naturalization under Section 67 (citizenship by naturalization) must be made—
 - (a) in the case of a person who has resided continuously in the country for eight years or more before Independence Day—within two months after Independence Day; and
 - (b) in the case of a foreign female married to an automatic citizen—at any time after the marriage;
 - (c) in the case of a foreign female married to a naturalized citizen—within two months of the marriage; and
 - (d) in the case of any other female spouse—when her husband applies for citizenship; and
 - (e) in the case of any other person—within two months after the completion by him of eight years continuous residence in the country."; and
- (b) by inserting after subsection (2) the following—
 - "(3) Where, before the commencement of his provision-
 - (a) a female had married a naturalized citizen, that female may, notwithstanding that she has not resided in the country continuously for eight years, apply for naturalization within two months of the commencement of this provision; and
 - (b) the female spouse of a naturalized citizen has failed to exercise a right to apply for citizenship within the period prescribed by subsection (1), this provision applies to give that spouse a right to apply for citizenship by naturalization within two months of this provision coming into operation and her application shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of this Part.".

Proposed Law to Alter the Constitution-continued

3. AUTOMATIC LOSS OF CITIZENSHIP (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 70).

Section 70 of the Constitution is amended by-

- (a) deleting from subsection (1) paragraph (g) and the words following and substituting the following—
- "(g) subject to subsection (3), travels under the protection of a passport or purported passport of another country in which he is described as a citizen or national of that country; or in the case of a naturalized citizen—
 - (b) is convicted of sedition or an offence relating to the security, defence and sovereignty of Papua New Guinea in relation to another country; or
 - (i) is convicted of an offence involving the possession, production, manufacturing, importation or otherwise dealing in cannabis, cocaine or opium, or their derivatives, from which a dangerous drug as defined by the Dangerous Drugs Act (Chapter 228), may be made; or
 - (j) has a major part of his investments and business interests, including savings, in a foreign country or a number of foreign countries; or
- (k) has a spouse who does not become a citizen under Sections 67 and 69 loses his citizenship."; and
- (b) inserting after subsection (3) the following new subsections—
 - "(4) In this section a person-
 - (a) "travels under the protection of a passport of another country" if he is actually in transit under a passport or purported passport of another country, or has in his possession a passport or purported passport of another country with evidence of recent use since Independence Day; and
 - (b) "has a major part of his investments and business interests in a foreign country" if, on the advice of the Citizenship Advisory Committee, the Minister responsible for citizenship matters forms the opinion that the total value in the Kina currency at the time of his total assets in a foreign country or a number of foreign countries is 52% of his total assets in value.
 - "(5) Where an applicant for citizenship by naturalization is required by Section 67(1) to reside in the country continuously for eight years or more, and the spouse of a naturalized female citizen is not yet qualified under that provision, the naturalized female citizen does not lose her citizenship until, after the eight year period, her spouse fails to apply for citizenship or his application is refused."

 - (f) on the advice of the Minister for Physical Planning (the nominating authority), revoke the appointment of Morris Alaluku as a member and Wesley Aruga as an alternate member of the Water Resources Board dated 3rd June, 1983 and published in National Gazette No. G37 of 16th June, 1983; and
 - (g) on the advice of the Prime Minister (the nominating authority), revoke the appointment of Ilinome Tarua as a member of the Water Resources Board dated 3rd June, 1983 and published in National Gazette No. G37 of 16th June, 1983; and
 - (b) on the advice of the Prime Minister (private sector) (the nominating authority), revoke the appointment of Philip Telesco as a member and John Haugie as an alternate member of the Water Resources Board dated 3rd June, 1983 and published in National Gazette No. G37 of 16th June, 1983; and

 - (v) the Minister for Physical Planning (the nominating authority), appoint Paul Japhlom to be a member and Morris Alaluku to be an alternate member of that Board; and
 - (vi) the Prime Minister (the nominating authority), appoint Andrew Yauieb to be a member of that Board; and
 - (vii) the Prime Minister (private sector) (the nominating authority), appoint John Haugie to be a member and James Seeto to be an alternate member of that Board; and
 - (viii) the Minister for Provincial Affairs (the nominating authority), appoint Michael Cobern to be an alternate member of that Board; and
- (k) in respect of each member of the Water Resources Board specified in Column 1 of the Schedule, appoint each person specified in Column 2, nominated by the person or authority, as the case may be, specified in Column 3 opposite the member, to be the alternate for the member of the Board specified in Column 1 opposite the name of the alternate in Column 2; and
- (1) appoint William McCann to be the Chairman of that Board.
