ROYAL WARRANT

The Papua New Guinea Tenth Anniversary of Independence Medal

ELIZABETH R

Elizabeth The Second, Queen of Papua New Guinea and of Her Other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth, to all to whom these presents shall come: Greeting!

WHEREAS Our Realm of Papua New Guinea attained independence on the 16th September, 1975;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that certain selected persons should be honoured in recognition of the Tenth Anniversary of that important event;

NOW THEREFORE We do, by this Warrant, institute and create a new Medal for Papua New Guinea.

Firstly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled "The Papua New Guinea Tenth Anniversary of Independence Medal".

Secondly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be in gilding metal and shall bear on the obverse the Royal and Crowned Effigy and on the reverse the National Emblem of Papua New Guinea with, in the upper circumference, the word "Independence" and in the lower circumference, the inscription "1975-1985".

Thirdly: It is ordained that recipients of the Medal shall be selected from among residents and former residents of Papua New Guinea who have rendered meritorious service to the community or to the nation continuously from 16th September, 1975 to 16th September, 1985: Provided that the Medal may be awarded to persons not possessing the required service, but who are distinguished persons whom it is deemed desirable to honour in recognition of the Tenth Anniversary of Independence.

Fourthly: It is ordained that the award of the Medal shall be made by instrument signed by Our Governor-General of Papua New Guinea: Provided that the Medal shall be granted only on the recommendation of Our Prime Minister of Papua New Guinea or by a Minister of the Crown deputising for Our Prime Minister.

Fifthly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn by recipients on the left breast suspended from a ribbon thirty-two millimetres in width, of red with a two millimetre central vertical white stripe, flanked on each side by a two millimetre black stripe and with two millimetre edges of yellow: Provided that when the Medal is worn by a woman, it may be worn on the left shoulder suspended from a ribbon of the same width and colour, fashioned into a bow.

Sixthly: It is ordained that in the official list showing the order in which Orders, Decorations and Medals shall be worn in Our Realm of Papua New Guinea, the Medal shall be worn after the Papua New Guinea Independence Medal and in front of the Service Medal of the Order of Saint John.

Seventhly: It is ordained that reproductions of the Medal known as a Miniature, which may be worn on certain occasions by those to whom the Medal is awarded, shall be half the size of the Medal.

Eighthly: It is ordained that it shall be competent for Our Governor-General, upon the recommendation of Our Prime Minister of Papua New Guinea, to cancel and annul the conferment of the Medal on any person and also to restore a Medal which has been so forfeited.

Royal Warrant—continued

Ninthly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration and other matters in amplication of these Our Rules and ordinances as may, with Our Approval, be issued from time to time by Our Governor-General.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these rules or ordinances, on any part thereof, by notification under Our Sign Manual.

Given Under the Seal of Our Realm of Papua New Guinea at Our Court at St. James's this Twenty Ninth Day of July, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty Five, in the Thirty-Fourth Year of Our Reign.
