### Organic Law on Provincial Government

THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL, by virtue of the powers contained in Section 187E(1) of the Constitution and Section 91A of the Organic Law on Provincial Government having considered a report from the Minister and being of the opinion that a ground for suspension exists and that the matter can only be put right by suspension, hereby provisionally suspends the Morobe Provincial Government with effect from the date of publication of this instrument in the National Gazette.

## Curfew Act 1987

#### PROCLAMATION OF CURFEW

I, Ignatius Kilage, G.C.M.G., C.B.E., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the *Curfew Act* 1987 and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby require every person within the boundaries of—

- (a) the City of Lae; and
- (b) the area including Busu, Bumayong, Soambu, Markham Bridge, to mouth of Markham River and back to Busu.

in Morobe Province to remain within doors between the hours of six o'clock in the evening (6 p.m.) and six o'clock in the morning (6 a.m.) for a period of two months commencing on and from six o'clock in the evening (6 p.m.) on Monday 11th September, 1989.
