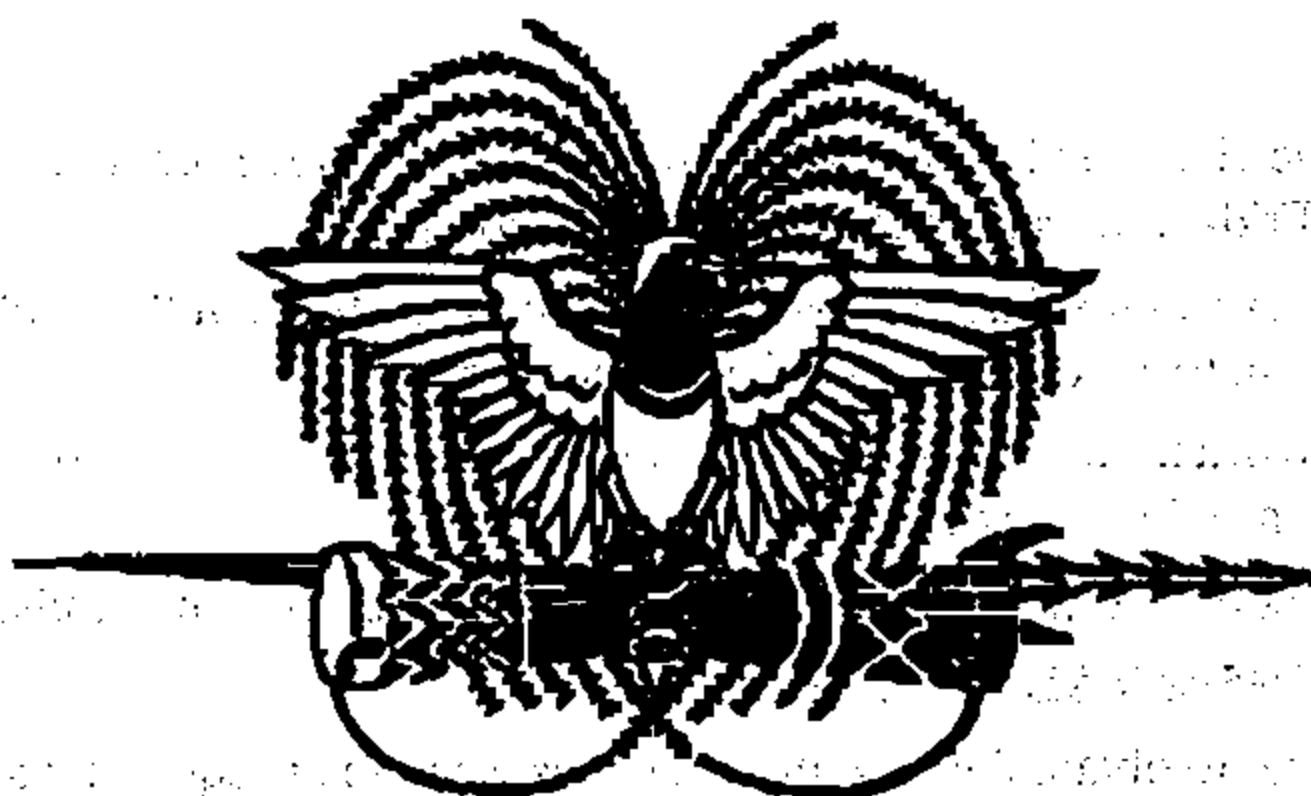
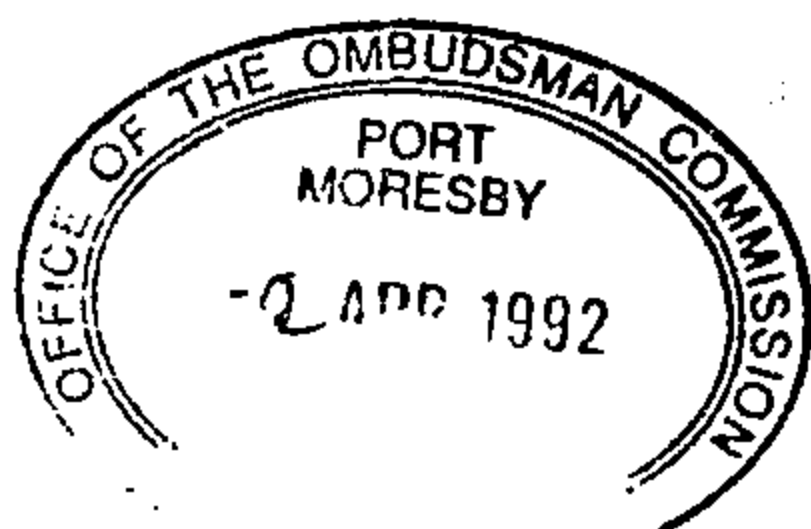

Accountants Registration Act (Chapter 89)**APPROVAL OF ACCOUNTANTS REGISTRATION AND PRACTICE RULES 1992**

I, Bernard M. Narokobi, Minister for Justice and Attorney-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 40(4) of the *Accountants Registration Act* (Chapter 89) and all other powers me enabling, hereby approve the *Accountants Registration and Practice Rules 1992*.

Accountants Registration Act (Chapter 89)**ACCOUNTANTS REGISTRATION AND PRACTICE RULES 1992**

being

A rule to repeal the Accountant Qualifications for Registration Rules.

MADE under the *Accountants Registration Act* (Chapter 89) to be deemed to have come into operation on 1st of April, 1991.

1. REPEAL.

The *Accountants Qualifications for Registration Rules* are hereby repealed.

2. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION AS A REGISTERED PUBLIC COMMERCIAL BOOKKEEPER.

The minimum qualifications for registration as a Registered Public Commercial Bookkeeper are –

- (a) either –
 - (i) possession of a Diploma in Commerce from the University of Papua New Guinea or the Papua New Guinea University of Technology; or
 - (ii) successful completion of the Commerce Certificate course of the Board of Commercial Studies, Department of Education including passes in Accounting III and Law II or its equivalent; or
 - (iii) such other education qualifications as are, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that referred to in Paragraphs (a)(i) and (a)(ii); and
- (b) employment in the duties of maintaining accounting records for the period of –
 - (i) five years; or
 - (ii) three years since obtaining the qualification referred to in Paragraph (a); and
- (c) membership of Papua New Guinea Association of Accountants Inc. at least at Affiliate level; and
- (d) be a person of good character.

Accountants Registration and Practice Rules 1992—continued**3. MINIMUM QUALIFICATION FOR REGISTRATION AS A REGISTERED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT.**

The minimum qualification for the registration as a Registered Public Accountant are —

- (a) either —
 - (i) possession of a degree of Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting) from the University of Papua New Guinea or the Papua New Guinea University of Technology; or
 - (ii) such other education qualifications as are equivalent to that referred to in Sub-paragraph (i); and
- (b) experience in accounting, including corporate accounting of such a nature and for such period (being not less than three years) as satisfies the Board that the applicant is fully competent to conduct the business of a Registered Public Accountant; and
- (c) membership of Papua New Guinea Association of Accountants Inc. at least at Associate level; and
- (d) be a person of good character.

4. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION AS A REGISTERED COMPANY AUDITOR.

(1) The minimum qualifications for registration as a Registered Company Auditor are —

- (a) be a registered Public Accountant; and
 - (b) be an Associate or Fellow of the Papua New Guinea Association of Accountants Inc. or the equivalent body in any other country as is recognised by the Board; and
 - (c) be of general conduct, character, experience and capacity as is considered satisfactory to the Board.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of Sub-section (1), the Auditor-General shall, for purposes of these rules, be deemed to be a Registered Company Auditor.

5. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION AS A REGISTERED LIQUIDATOR.

The minimum qualifications for registration as a Registered Liquidator are —

- (a) be a registered Company Auditor; and
- (b) have experience and capacity as is considered satisfactory to the Board.

The right to carry on business in an activity in respect of which the Enterprise is registered may be terminated or suspended by the Minister by not less than one year prior written notice to the Enterprise. Such notice shall not be given before the second anniversary of the date of registration.
3. The following provision shall be made by the Enterprise for Papua New Guinea investment in, and participation in the ownership, management and control of the Enterprise.
 - (i) From the date of commencement a 37% equity in the Enterprise is to be beneficially owned by an automatic citizen or citizens of Papua New Guinea or by a local enterprise as that term is defined in Section 2 of the *National Investment and Development Act* (Chapter 120).
4. The Enterprise shall not without the prior approval of the Minister establish a place of business in any location in Papua New Guinea other than Bootless Bay, Port Moresby.
5. If the Enterprise has not at the expiration of six months from the date of registration commenced carrying on business in any of the activities for which it is hereby registered, it shall not thereafter commence such activity without the prior written consent of NIDA.
6. The Enterprise shall keep all its books of account and other financial records in Papua New Guinea in the English language.
7. The Enterprise will comply with all and any obligations and conditions relating to the training of citizens and the localization of its staff (including both employees and officers of the Enterprise) which may from time to time be laid down by the Secretary for the Department of Labour and Employment (or any other Department which succeeds to the functions of that Department) or prescribed or declared under the *Employment of Non-Citizens Act* (Chapter 274) or any other Act in force from time to time dealing with training and localization of staff.
8. The Enterprise shall guide and assist Papua New Guinea enterprises in activities ancillary to the registered activities.
9. The Enterprise shall use supplies and services (particularly in relation to subcontracting) available within Papua New Guinea, preferably provided by Papua New Guineans provided that such supplies and services are readily available at prices and of a quality similar to those obtainable from other sources.
10. The Enterprise shall at all times conduct its operations in such a way as to minimize deleterious effects on the environment and shall abide by any reasonable standards specified by the Minister responsible for environmental matters.
11. Any application by the Enterprise to the Minister with regard to any of the foregoing conditions shall be made in writing to the Executive Director of NIDA.

The Enterprise should note that Sections 4(3) and 5 of the *National Investment and Development Act* (Chapter 120) provide that NIDA registration in respect of a particular activity does not of itself relieve the Enterprise from compliance with any other law and no condition of registration confers on an Enterprise any right or privilege in relation to a matter that is the subject of any other law.
