## **EXEMPTION FROM IMPORT DUTY**

I, Wiwa Korowi, G.C.M.G., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 9(1)(a) of the Customs Tariff Act 1990, and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby, with effect on and from the date of publication of this instrument in the National Gazette exempt from payment of import duty the goods imported by or on behalf of the National Events Council for solely and exclusively for use by the Council for the 20th Anniversary Celebrations specified in the Schedule subject to such conditions as are specified in the Schedule.

## **SCHEDULE**

- 1. Office Computer Equipment
- 2. Computer Monitors
- 3. Computer Printers
- 4. Facsimile Machines
- 5. Photocopier Machines and Photocopy paper
- 6. Electronic Scanners and Shredders
- 7. Flags, Banners and Bunting
- 8. Pyrotechnic (Fireworks) Material
- 9. Balloons, Inflatables and Balloon Gas or Helium
- 10. Flag Poles and Scaffolding
- 11. Printed material such as decals and adhesive stickers
- 12. Coloured cardboard and plastic moulded material.

Any goods remaining upon the conclusion of the 20th Anniversary Celebrations or the termination of tenure of the National Events Council whichever occurs later shall not be sold or otherwise disposed of other than by way of a public auction to be supervised by the Internal Revenue Commission. If this condition is not complied with, the Commissioner-General may at his sole discretion charge import duty at the date of disposal on the CIF value of the goods at the date of original importation.
