**DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTERS**

I, Bill Skate, Prime Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 148 of the *Constitution* and all other powers me enabling, hereby:—

- (a) revoke all previous Determinations of Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers; and  
 (b) determine that each Minister set out in Column 1 of each Schedule shall have:—
- (i) the title specified in Column 1; and
  - (ii) the responsibilities specified in Column 2; and
  - (iii) the responsibilities for administering the Acts (or part of an Act) specified in Column 3, and set out opposite the name of the Minister,
- to come into effect on and from the date of signature of this instrument.
