REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF ACTING DEPARTMENTAL HEAD

REVOCATION OF ACTING APPOINTMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF DEPARTMENTAL HEAD

I, Grand Chief Sir Paulias Matane, G.C.L., G.C.M.G., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Sections 193(1A) and (1C) of the Constitution and Sections 31A and 31C of the *Public Services (Management) Act* 1995, and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council given after consultation with the Public Services Commission, hereby:—

- (a) revoke the appointment of Dr. Nicholas Mann as Acting Secretary for the Department of Health as contained in the Notice of Acting Appointment of Departmental Head dated 18th January, 2006 and published in the National Gazette No. G24 of 2nd February, 2006; and
- (b) appoint Dr. Clement Malau to be Secretary for the Department of Health for a period of four (4) years, commencing on and from the date of publication of this instrument in the National Gazette.
