CONSTITUTION

AMENDMENT OF DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITES OF MINISTERS

- I, Michael Thomas Somare, Prime Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 148 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, hereby amend the determination of Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers dated 29th August, 2002 and published in the *National Gazetee* No. G138 (as amended)—
 - (a) in Schedule 5, in Column 4, by inserting at the end of the following:—
 - "and except in relation to approval of requisitions, under Section 32, for expenditure of trust monies or fund for health and education matters"; and
 - (b) in Schedule 14, in Column 4, by inserting the following:-
 - "Public Finances (Management) Act 1995 (only in relation to approval of requisition, under Section 32, for expenditure of trust monies or fund for education matters"; and
 - (c) in Schedule 22, in Column 4, by inserting the following:—
 - "Public Finances (Management) Act 1995 (only in relation to approval of requisition, under Section 32, for expenditure of trust monies or fund for health and HIV Aids matters)".
