Customs Tariff Act 1990

EXEMPTION FROM IMPORT DUTY

I, Grand Chief Sir Paulias Matane, G.C.L., G.C.M.G., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 9(1)(a) of the *Customs Tariff Act* 1990 and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby, exempt from import duty, on the importation of 150,000 Rubber Hybrid Budded Stumps of Latex Timber Clones from Malaysia for the Rubber development and Rehabilitation of Rubber Industry in (PNG) and items as set out in Schedule.
