THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE) (JUSTICE OF APPEAL) REGULATIONS 2008

IN exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of The Constitutional Offices (Terms sand Conditions of Service) Act the Prime Minister hereby makes the following Regulations –

Citation	1.	These Regulations may be cited as The Constitutional Offices (Terms and Conditions of Service) (Justice of Appeal) Regulations 2008, and shall be deemed to have come into force on 1 st January, 2008.
Term of Office	2.	The term of office of the Justice of the Court of Appeal shall be subject to the provisions of Section 87 of the Constitution.
Duties	3.	The duties of the Justice of Appeal shall be as prescribed under Part II (b) of Chapter VII of the Constitution.
Accommodation	4.	The cost of accommodation of a Justice of Appeal during the period of the Court of Appeal Sittings shall be paid for by the Solomon Islands Government.
PerDemAllowance	5.	(1) The Justice of Appeal shall be entitled to a daily allowance of USD250.00 to cover the cost of meals and incidentals during the duration of the Court of Appeal and whilst in transit during travel to and from Solomon Islands.
		(2) Where the spouse of the Justice of Appeal accompanies him on an

(2) Where the spouse of the Justice of Appeal accompanies him on an official visit, the spouse shall be entitled to be paid a daily allowance at the same rate payable to the Justice of Appeal.

The Justice of Appeal shall be entitled to a preparation fee of USD 1,000, sitting allowance of USD400 per day commencing on the day court convenes and when the session concludes, and judgment writing allowance at the rate of USD400 per day but not exceeding 10 days as certified by the President of Appeal.
lass of Travel	8.	(1) The Justice of Appeal shall be entitled to travel first class (where available, or the next available class of travel) on all official visits at Government expenses.s
		(2) The spouse of the Justice of Appeal shall be entitled to travel first class (where available, or the next available class of travel) when accompanying the Justice of Appeal on such visits at Government expense subject to the availability of funds.
ledical Treatment	9.	The Justice of Appeal shall be entitled to medical treatment free of charge in Solomon Islands Government hospitals and or medical expenses from a private clinic whilst on official visit.
eath during cumbency	10.	Where the Justice of Appeal dies whilst on official visit the Government shall pay all funeral expenses and all other related costs incidental thereto.
ecurity	11.	(1) The Government shall be responsible for providing adequate security for the Justice of Appeal as and when needed.

THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE) ACT (CAP. 84)

THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE) (PRESIDENT OF APPEAL) REGULATIONS 2008

IN exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of The Constitutional Offices (Terms and Conditions of Service) Act the Prime Minister hereby makes the following Regulations –

Citation	1.	These Regulations may be cited as The Constitutional Offices (Terms and Conditions of Service) (President of Appeal) Regulations 2008, and shall be deemed to have come into force on 1st January 2008.
Term of Office	2.	The term of office of the President of the Court of Appeal shall be subject to the provisions of Section 87 of the Constitution.
Duties	3.	The duties of the President of Appeal shall be as prescribed under Part II (b) of Chapter VII of the Constitution.
Accommodation	4.	The cost of accommodation of the President of Appeal during the period of the Court of Appeal Sitting shall be paid for by the Solomon Islands Government.
Per Diem Allowance	5.	(i) The President of Appeal shall be entitled to a daily allowance of USD250.00 to cover the cost of meals and incidentals during the duration of the Court of Appeal and whilst in transit during travel to and from Solomon Islands.
		(ii) Where the spouse of the President of Appeal accompanies him on an official visit, the spouse shall be entitled to be paid a daily allowance at the same rate payable to the President of Appeal.
Transport	6.	The costs of transport of the President of Appeal during the Court of Appeal Sittings shall be provided for by the Government of Solomon Islands.

- Preparation, Sitting Allowance 7. The President of Appeal shall be entitled to a preparation fee of USD1,000.00 sitting allowance of USD500 per day commencing on the day court convenes and when the session concludes, and judgement writing allowance at the rate of USD500 per day but not exceeding 10 days as certified by the Chief Justice.
- (i) The President of Appeal shall be entitled to travel first class (where available, or the next available class of travel) on all official visits at Government expense.

(ii) The spouse of the President of Appeal shall be entitled to travel first class (where available, or the next available class of travel) when accompanying the President of Appeal on such visits at Government expense subject to the availability of funds.

- bdcalTreatment 9. The President of Appeal shall be entitled to medical treatment free of charge in Solomon Islands Government hospitals and medical expenses from a private clinic whilst on official visit.
- ^{cath} during cumbercy 10. Where the President of Appeal dies whilst on official visit the Government shall pay all funeral expenses and all other related costs incidental thereto.
- 11. (1) The Government shall be responsible for providing adequate security for the President as and when needed when on official visit.

(2) Where the provision of security is provided by security personnel other than by the Police or Prison Service, it shall be paid for by the Government.
