THERAPEUTICS GOODS (AMENDMENT) ACT 2014 Act 1 of 2014

AN ACT TO AMEND THE THERAPEUTICS GOODS ACT 2001

I assent, TUPOU VI, 19th June 2014.

BE IT ENACTED by the King and Legislative Assembly of Tonga in the Legislature of the Kingdom as follows:

1 Short title

- (1) This Act may be cited as the Therapeutic Goods (Amendment) Act 2014.
- (2) The Therapeutics Goods Act 2001 is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section 2 amended

Section 2 of the Principal Act is amended by inserting the following definition in the correct alphabetical order –

""nurse practitioner" means a person duly registered as such under the Nurses Act 2001;".

3 Section 20 amended

Section 20 of the Principal Act is amended by inserting the following new subsection (2A) after subsection (2) -

"(2A) Any nurse practitioner may write prescriptions for medicinal drugs included in Classes 1 and 2 of the registered list, and may write prescriptions for medicinal drugs included in Class 3 of the registered list on the advice of a medical practitioner.".

4 Section 21 amended

The proviso to section 21(1) of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after the words "health officer" the following ", nurse practitioner".

5 Section 22 amended

Section 22 of the Principal Act is amended -

- (a) in subsection (2) by inserting after the words "health officer" the following ", nurse practitioner"; and
- (b) in subsection (3)(g) by inserting after the words "health officer" the following ", nurse practitioner".

6 Section 23 amended

Section 23(1) of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after the word "nurse" the following ", nurse practitioner".

7 Section 29 amended

Section 29(1) of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after the word "nurse" the following ", nurse practitioner".
